






Company Size By Employees













Core Themes Roundup

Next Generation Security

Setting the scene for the day's proceedings, the keynote session from Head European Analyst Duncan Brown started with some startling figures.

- Global security incidents rose by 48%
- Over 50% of malware stays undetected by antivirus products
- PC infections have risen by a factor of 14.5 since mid-2012
- DDoS attacks doubled Q1 2014 to Q1 2015, yoy
- 75% of attacks spread from Victim 0 to Victim 1 within 24 hours
- Heartbleed was exploited within 4 hours of becoming public
- 317m new malwares created last year

Duncan concluded that enterprises needed more threat prevention, in addition to a shift from breach prevention to breach preparation.

The Convergence of Identity & Mobility Management

During this session Andy Bryars, Regional Sales Manager from Okta explored the continuous changes in the traditional IT landscape. By introducing and voicing some interesting real life statistics and examples, Andy outlined how collaboration, convergence and competition is driving the market – and security is a layer on top of those.



Andy finalised by outlining that end users must look at 3 core pillars whilst looking at security solutions:

- Enabling services that will allow your business to grow faster
- Increasing operational efficiency whilst decreases costs
- Secures my enterprise environment and satisfies compliance















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Finding the Necessary Balance between Business Security, Innovation and Competitiveness

Director of Security Operations Centre Becky Pinkard of Pearson took the stage to explain the right-sized approach for risk (and budget) appetite.

Becky's findings were that enterprises need to better understand the depth and breadth of their infrastructure, in order to successfully be able to map and monitor critical users and data assets. Becky concluded that in today's world it is vital to perform the basics solidly and consistently, whilst picking your IT security battles based on their enterprise risk profile



Identity is a New Parameter

Centrify's CTO Barry Scott, dived into the topic of the traditional Enterprise perimeter, and how the barriers between inside and outside a company has changed. Barry outlined how data, systems and applications may be anywhere; and so are users, but are enterprise intranets safer than the Internet? The consensus was that they are like for like, meaning you need to secure access to resources, and specifically what is trying to gain access – the user's identity.

The session also covered how when properly managed, the combination of Identity, the device being used and the target apps or servers, provide a complete Enterprise security policy for end and privileged users.

A Secure Connected Enterprise

Dragan Pendic, Chief Security Architect from Diageo shared his experiences and key takeaways on how to tackle security measures whilst enabling a connected enterprise. Some of his recommended key takeaways are:

- Improvements in security require a mindset and a culture change
- Security is a product TREAT IT LIKE ONE!
- Genuinely understand limitations of current security technologies and controls
- Make the new technology & security concepts digestible, relevant and realistic


















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Security for the Agile Enterprise

Fortinet' Systems Engineering Manager, Paulo Rodrigues, mentioned that in order to become ever more efficient and competitive, enterprises are transforming their IT environments to achieve more flexibility, agility and efficiency, whilst reducing costs and footprint.

Quick Fire Takeaways

- Identity is key
- The industry in relation to IT security is showing a lack of standards
- It is very easy to get lost within your own enterprises internal drivers, however it is also key to keep an eye on external drivers
- End user engagement is critical as they are the enterprise bloodline
- Security solutions must be flexible and expandable with the future in mind
- Ensure that secure access is the easiest option for users, but you must also ensure the level of security and access that you're giving
- Enterprises need to have clearer security policies for data and cloud solutions and strategies
- Enterprise's security architecture must cater for the inevitable move to the cloud















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


Conference Feedback

(5= excellent, 4= good, 3= acceptable, 2= below expectations, 1=poor)


Speaker Evaluation

Vendor Perception


















Tweet Reach for #IDCSecurity15


